Bunk Beds and Mattresses will be delivered at a variety of places both Tegucigalpa and San Pedro Sula, to include but not limited to: Chamelecon, Rivera Hernandez, Satellite, Belen, Manchen, La Kennedy. Vendor is to coordinate all delivery and installations with the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR).

Vendor shall transport bunk beds in the original packing, and assemble and install onsite. Some of the dormitory doors are too small for pre-assembled furniture to fit inside.

Vendor shall remove all trash and debris from worksite.

Vendor shall have a management supervisor onsite at all times while performing deliveries and installation, and shall provide name, email, and phone number to COR at least hours in advance of delivery. Furniture assemblers and installers shall be clean and neat in appearance. Vendor must submit identification of employees performing delivery and assembly, and vehicle information, to COR at least 96 hours prior to delivery.

Delivery is expected to begin within 3 weeks after the purchase order is received. Partial deliveries can be made with a minimum of 10 bunk beds (with the mattresses each time).

Delivery must be completed no later than ten (10) weeks after receipt of purchase order.
